Recipe Easy sweet potato and lentil soup

Ingredients (makes 8 bowls)

About 3 tbsp olive or sunflower oil 5 large carrots

1 large or 2 med sweet potatoes

2 onions

1 leek

100g red lentils

2 tsp ground cumin and coriander Black pepper and dried chilli

1.5L veg stock

Method

Heat oil in a large pan

Chop veg into similar size pieces

Add to pan, stir to coat with oil, put lid on and cook over low heat for 15-20 mins. Stir now and then.

Add the spices and pepper, a little chilli to taste and the lentils, stir over heat then add the stock. Gently simmer for 20-25 mins, then blend (but not too much if you want to have some texture)

Make your own Playdough

Mix 8 tablespoons of plain flour and 2 tablespoons of salt in a large bowl. In a separate bowl mix 60mls of warm water and food colouring of your choice. Pour the coloured water in to the dry ingredients and use a spoon to mix. Knead the dough until it is smooth and pliable. What will you make with your Playdough?

Rainforest Sound Machine

Find a paper plate (or anything else you can fold over to seal). Put some rice (or beans/pulses) in the middle of the plate and use sellotape to seal the edges. Tip the plate upside down and side to side and listen to the noise it makes – does it sound like a rainforest? What animals live in the rainforest? Could you play a song with your rainforest sound machine?

In the garden or on a walk


Rock Bugs

See if you can find a big, flat, smooth rock in your garden. Can you colour/paint it to look like a ladybird? (you can use nail varnish too as this dries super quickly!) Maybe you could hide your ladybird in your garden and see if someone else in your family can find it? Can you see any other insects in your garden?

Make a Bird Feeder

Cover a toilet roll tube/kitchen roll tube in peanut butter and roll it in seeds or bread crumbs, then use string to hang it up outside. How many different types of birds can you see? Do any other animals eat from your bird feeder?
